## New bridge to link busy areas in Quincy Center

Motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians will soon have a new option for traveling from Hancock Street to the Thomas E. Burgin Parkway in Quincy Center.

Generals Bridge will create a new connection between areas of high activity in Quincy Center, and will honor military veterans and modern-day generals with roots in Quincy, representatives of the Koch administration told city councilors at a meeting March 5.

The state's Department of Transportation is funding the \$7 million cost of the bridge and will maintain it once it is built, said Frank Tramontozzi, an engineer with the city who works on downtown projects.

Quincy residents will have a chance Monday to weigh in on the city's plans to take land by eminent domain for the construction of a new bridge in Quincy Center.

Generals Bridge will extend Cliveden Street between Hancock Street and the Thomas E. Burgin Parkway. It will have plaques honoring military veterans and modern-day generals with roots in Quincy.

The state Department of Transportation is funding the \$7 million cost of the bridge, but the city must obtain the rights of way. Construction is expected to begin by the end of the year. The public hearing starts at 7 p.m. at City Hall.
